

























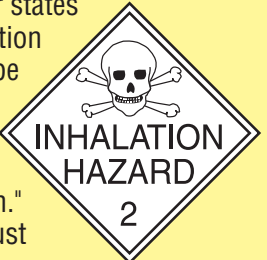

Class 7 (Yellow III)				<p><b>TOXIC BY INHALATION</b> Effective 10-1-97 these are required in addition to Div. 2.3 and Div. 6.1 current label and placard. Materials which have been identified as Toxic by Inhalation, and the shipping paper states "Poison-Inhalation Hazard" must be marked "Inhalation Hazard" and labeled "Poison." The vehicle must be placarded "Poison" or "Poison Gas" as appropriate in addition to the primary hazard requirements. <b>Note: 1,000 lb exception does not apply to these materials.</b></p>
